1. Introduction

The external website (www.sustinafrica.com) is built to communicate and disseminate project-related information to a wider audience. The objective of the website is to provide a brief summary of the project and inform about ongoing and future activities. SustInAfrica`s website operates mainly in English, but summaries and news will be made also in e.g. Arabic and French.

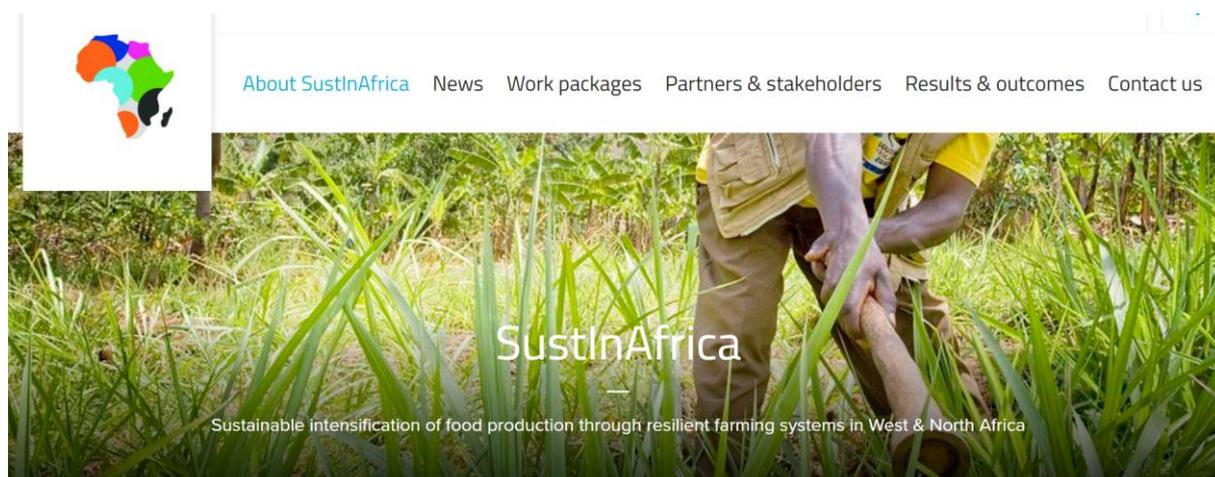


Fig 1 : www.sustinafrica.com header and main menu

2. Life span of the website

3. Responsibilities

Frontpage aims to present the project very briefly and to give basic information like funder, overall funding amount, duration and coordinator. It invites people to discover the page and its content further.

News page will provide a place to find all project related news briefly published. News items will also be shared in social media channels and if relevant linked to news published on partner organisations’ websites.

Work packages page presents the actual work of the project and how it is divided to meaningful entities. Each work package is presented with name, lead partner of the WP and main objectives.

Partners & stakeholders page presents the SustInAfrica consortium, their partners and geographical coverage of the project. At this page stakeholders who agreed in publishing their contact details will be published to describe and promote their role in the SustInAfrica project.



We also add a weblink to the [Mergdata platform](#) operated by Farmeline Ltd. As their platform is an essential tool used in training and education activities (mainly WP4).

Results & outcomes page will be the platform to present and share project results, tools, publications and other outcomes. The visual design of the page will be discussed further when the project has achieved its first results.
